In the account of the disastrous railroad wreck near Rochester published yesterday, was included among the names of the injured that of James M. Lumbard. The dispatches give the following about him:

James M. Lumbard, sign painter, resides No. 5 Charlotte street, twenty-nine years old, married; abdomen and spine badly injured, nervous system entirely unstrung. Lumbard is continually raving about women calling for help and asks to be taken away. He is now at the Hahneman hospital.

The injured man is a nephew and namesake of James M. Lumbard, the well known employe of the Gazette composing room. The injured man recently moved to Rochester from Canandaigua, where he had secured a fine position. Three weeks ago he came to this city and did all of the fine sign painting work about the Elmira Arms company store on West Water street. Mr. Lumbard is well known in this city and has a number of relatives here who will watch anxiously for his recovery. A telegram inquiring as to his condition was sent to Rochester today.
