### Sad Accident.

At Lake creek on the 2nd, inst. Mr. James D. Lumbard met with a serious injury from the accidental discharge of a shot gun. He was on horseback and in the act of picking up his gun leaning against the fence, when one load was discharged tearing away the entire muscle from his left arm just below the shoulder.

Dr. Lucas, the neighborhood physician, was immediately called in but did not dress the wound, stating he would call again for that purpose the next day, twenty-four hours after the accident.

P. Stanton, Esq. Mr. Lumbard's father-in-law hearing of the accident the next morning, immediately brought the young man home and Dr. Boon of this place was sent for and the wound properly dressed. From loss of blood and delay in dressing the wound, Mr. Lumbard is very weak, though his arm will probably be saved.
