The body of Charles E. Lumbard, formerly of Brimfield was brought from Worcester for burial in the family lot in the Brimfield cemetery Thursday afternoon. Mr Lumbard was a veteran of the civil war having been a corporal in Co G of the 46th regiment of Massachusetts volunteers under Capt Francis D. Lincoln of Brimfield. He was born in Brimfield, October 6, 1832, the son of Absalom and Prudence (Willard) Lumbard. He was married November 18, 1858, to Miss Lizzie M. Merrill who survives him. The home of Mr and Mrs Lumbard was for many years in Southbridge where their daughter, Miss Cora, died in her early womanhood. Mr Lumbard's health had been failing for some time and he died in Oak Ledge sanitarium in Worcester where he had been since last spring.
