

DIVORCED MAN TO WED DIVORCEE

SAN FRANCISCO, Dec. 12.—Mrs. Ivy Frances Crane, former actress and dancer, and Gay Lombard, flour miller, 1217 Jones street, have received a license to be married. Within the past two months both received final decrees of divorce, and this will be Lombard's third marriage.

Lombard sued Mrs. Mary Tongue Lombard, of Portland, for divorce, alleging cruelty, but she received the decree on a cross complaint alleging desertion, a year ago. In Portland at the time he was active in politics, being twice a candidate for mayor. He charged that she ridiculed him and disapproved of his friends.

Mrs. Crane obtained her decree in November, from Douglas Crane, on the grounds of desertion and neglect. Prior to their divorce they were dancers at the St. Francis, and for a time Mrs. Crane was hostess at the Cliff House.

Lombard, prior to his divorce, settled \$50,000 upon his wife, and \$250 a month alimony. Mrs. Crane has a young son.
