

RITES HELD AT QUINCY FOR ARTHUR C. LOMBARD

QUINCY, April 16—The funeral of Arthur C. Lombard, 69, 138 Grandview av, Wollaston, for many years identified with the lumber industry, took place this afternoon at the Waldo B. Fay funeral home. Rev Stuart C. Haskins, pastor of the Wollaston Congregational Church, officiated. Burial will be in the Old North Cemetery, Truro.

Mr Lombard was born in Charlestown; spending most of his early life in Somerville and Boston. As a young man he became associated with a Kansas City bank. Several years later he organized the Carey-Lombard Lumber Company.

He was associated with the William Parkman Lodge of Masons in Woburn, Boston Commandery, K. T., and Aleppo Temple, Mystic Shrine. He is survived by his wife, Mrs Estelle (Hatch) Lombard; three sons, James A., Samuel H. and David C. Lombard, and two daughters, Mrs Priscilla L. Mayberry and Miss Esther H. Lombard.
