

PROMINENT LOCAL COUPLE MARRIED

Mrs James Gardner Dunning Becomes Wife of James D. Gill in Ceremony at New York

A wedding of wide local interest took place at New York city Saturday when Mrs James Gardner Dunning of Federal street became the bride of James D. Gill, well-known local art dealer.

Mrs Dunning was the widow of the late Atty J. G. Dunning, for decades a distinguished member of the Hampden county bar, with offices in this city. Previous to her marriage to Mr Dunning she was the wife of Charles Clinton Abbey, a prominent merchant and real estate dealer of Springfield and Chicopee, his home being in the latter city.

Mr Gill has for many years been prominent as a dealer in art. He was formerly United States collector of internal revenue, holding that office for more than a quarter of the time since the establishment of that branch of the government. His appointment was one of the first made by President McKinley. This is Mr Gill's second marriage, his former wife having been Evelyn Clyde, daughter of the late Milton A. Clyde and sister of Mrs Charles L. Long.

The couple have been friends for many years. They are now on an extended trip, following which they will return to this city to establish their home here.
