A benefit concert for Jules Lumbard at the Illinois theater, which revived vividly songs and scenes of war times, neted a sum of \$1,000 for him. Men scattered all over the country now, men whose hair is silvered, recall the days when Jules Lumbard sang "Old Shady," "Marching Through Georgia" and other songs which did so much to sustain the patriotic ardor of "those who stayed at home" during the war of the blue and the gray.
